

Mosaic Tray DIY

You will need:

Tray – there are many to choose from at EveryStep Giving Tree

Paint

Grout – we used grout made for stepping stones, which we purchased at a craft store.

Glue – we used glue made especially for mosaics, which we also purchased at a craft store.

Hammer

Eye protection

Old colorful plates. Look for those with flat surfaces (they'll be easier to attach and grout).

Paper bag(s)

Dish towel

Instructions:

- 1. If desired, paint the front, back and sides (inside and out) of the tray. We used three coats of paint, letting dry according to instructions between each coat.
- 2. As paint is drying, place your plates, one at a time, inside one or more paper bags. Place on a hard surface, such as a sidewalk or countertop. Cover the bag with a dish towel.
- 3. Using eye protection, hammer the plate into desired size of pieces.
- 4. BE CAREFUL AS YOU OPEN THE BAG TO CHECK THE PLATE PIECES. THERE WILL BE SHARP EDGES.
- 5. Sort plate pieces into colors (it makes it easier to create a design). Again, be aware of sharp edges.
- 6. Arrange the pieces on the completely dry tray until you have a design you like. Lift each piece and glue back into place.
- 7. When glue is completely dry, mix and apply grout according to package directions. Follow package directions for drying time and polishing instructions.
- 8. Enjoy!
