

Sweater Pumpkin

You will need:

Foam or other hollow pumpkin form Glue gun Old sweater, preferably one with an interesting pattern on the sleeves Sharp cutting tool, like a knife or box cutter Scissors Thick twine or rope Decorations, as desired

Instructions:

- 1. Cut the sleeve from the sweater at the shoulder seam.
- 2. Cut a hole in the top and bottom of the pumpkin.
- 3. Insert pumpkin into removed sleeve. Make sure the pattern is running in the direction you desire.
- 4. Push the fabric at the top and bottom of the pumpkin into the holes. You may need to trim the fabric to avoid having too much surplus. Sometimes a dull, pointed object like the eraser end of a pencil helps in this process.
- 5. Cut about 3 inches of twine, then double it over and glue the sides together to create a stem. Make the stem as long as you desire.
- 6. Glue the stem into the hole at the top of the pumpkin.
- 7. If desired, add other decorative elements like leaves, berries, etc.
