Community Interpreter Training courses help your bilingual staff become competent and confident in interpreting often-complicated topics. After completing our training, participants will have learned sound listening and memory skills, ethics and standards to apply during interpretation encounters. Through handson, interactive sessions, they will become prepared to conduct flawless interpretation sessions, benefiting both the people you serve and your organization.

Course Offerings

We offer 3 levels of courses depending on participants' needs and previous training.

Level I

A 1-day, interactive course that focuses on basic interpretation skills and terminology, ethics, standards of practice, and the theoretical framework and concrete skills needed for a community interpreter.

Level II

A 2-day course that expands on Level 1 with in-depth study of ethics, standards of practice. Additional topics include mediation, intervention skills, culture componenets, remote video interpretation and understanding barriers in communication.

Level III

Advanced training with emphasis on interpreter self-care, American phrases/idioms, improving memory skills and interpretation in the mental health field.

Medical Terminology

A 12 to 14-hour course covering in-depth medical terminology.

How to Work With an Interpreter

A 1-hour course designed for managers, teachers, medical professionals and other staff who use interpreters to communicate with non-English speaking individuals.



Qualifications

Participants must:

- Be 18 years of age or older.
- Have a high school diploma or equivalent.
- Demonstrate bilingualism and literacy in English and at least one other language, preferably by showing proof of validated language proficiency test.

Cost

The cost of our training courses are tailored to an organization's specific needs. Courses are sold as group sessions for a minimum of 10 and up to 20 participants.

Our session rates range from \$1,500 to \$4,000 per group, depending on the course level and desired learning outcomes. Please contact us directly if you have fewer than 10 employees interested in training opportunities. Course registration includes training materials, resources and professional development activities.

Courses are held several times thoughout the year, and are typically located in the Des Moines area.
